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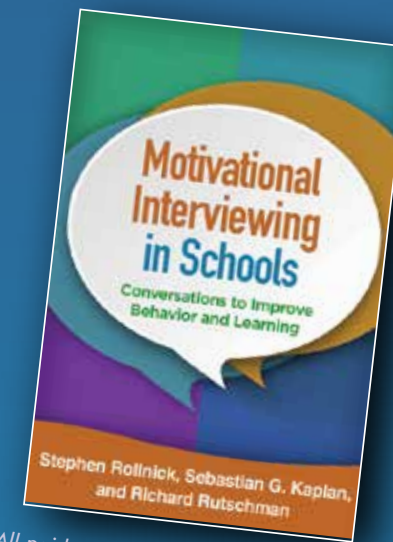
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DESCRIPTION

Richard Rutschman, Ed.D.



For two and a half decades he has supported schools in innovative partnership programs as part of Northeastern Illinois University's Center for College Access & Success (previously: Chicago Teachers' Center) to improve outcomes. He has administered programs focusing on dropout prevention, college

post-secondary preparation, teambuilding/experiential learning, restorative discipline practices, and enhancing student motivation. During this time he has facilitated professional development workshops, institutes and conference presentations in the U.S. and abroad in English & Spanish. For the past ten years, his work with students has focused on enhancing motivation of vulnerable students by combining experiential education (adventure-based) and Motivational Interviewing. "He has found introducing and modeling the use of MI in schools exciting and just co-authored a book for schools on that topic (with Stephen Rollick, co-founder of Motivational Interviewing)."

Prior experiences include being a school principal, the executive director of a Chicago multi-service youth organization, teaching high school Science and Spanish, mentoring, counseling and being a youth advocate for at-risk youth. He obtained his doctorate from Northern Illinois University in Adult Education focusing on experiential learning. He is a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers.
